Mr. Arrington: Unfortunately, for the country, our allies, and interests, and for the entire world order, President Biden continues to be inexcusably feckless in his response to global threats from our adversaries.

Now, in the moment of truth, when America can send a clear and unequivocal message to dictators and democracies alike by banning Russian oil imports to the U.S., the President has failed once again to rise to the occasion.
